

Bosque County 4-H Awards and Recognition Task Force Scholarship Program

The Bosque County 4-H Awards & Recognition Task Force will be awarding up to six scholarships in the amounts of \$1,000 and \$750 during graduation ceremonies for deserving graduating 4-H seniors. The scholarships will be awarded to students who will be enrolling in college by September 1 of the following school year. The choice of recipients will be based on the following criteria:

- Leadership Ability
- Community Service
- 4-H Involvement
- Consistent Effort in Academics
- Must be a 4-H member for a minimum of two years including the current year.
- Must be a 4-H member in good standing according to the Bosque County 4-H Handbook.

Each applicant must complete the following steps:

1. Return the attached form to:

- 2. <u>Two Important Dates:</u>
 - A. March 29, 2018 Application Deadline
 - B. December 31, 2018 Letter of accomplishment and copy of college transcript
- 3. Recipients of scholarship will provide a letter and transcript to the Bosque County Extension Office within two weeks of the end of the fall semester giving an update of college attended, major, number of hours credit received and a brief description of college experiences. The transcript can be an unofficial copy. To receive the second half of the scholarship the grades must reflect a passing GPA. The information in the letter will be used to inform donors to the 4-H program and scholarships of your success. If letter and transcript are not received by December 31, 2018, the second half of the scholarship will be forfeited.
- 4. To be eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship, a complete 4-H Record Book must have been completed and submitted for judging at least once during their years as a senior 4-H member (senior age division 14-19 years of age). Record Books should accompany the application. The quality of the record must be of high standard so that it has (or could) advance to District 8 4-H Record Book Judging Contest. Complete the short scholarship application form attached (2 pages). Attach three letters of recommendation from principal or teacher, employer, minister or a non-family member who can attest to the member's character and qualifications that would reflect criteria.



- 5. To be eligible for a \$750 scholarship, complete the long application form attached (4 pages). Attach three letters of recommendations from principal or teacher, employer, minister or a non-family member who can attest to the member's character and qualifications that would reflect criteria.
- 6. Payment will be made directly to the college, university, or technical school in two payments. Half of the total amount will be paid for the fall semester, and the second half will be paid for the spring semester upon receipt of the unofficial transcript and letter of accomplishment. You will forfeit the scholarship if letter and transcript are not received by December 31, 2018. The student must remain enrolled for at least one full semester or the first half of the award must be returned to the returned to the Bosque County Awards and Recognition Task Force and second half will not be awarded.
- 7. Return by March 29, 2018.
- **8.** Applications will be reviewed by a panel of judges.
